

16-19 tuition fund implementation plan (2021-22)

Southborough High School has applied for a 16-19 tuition fund grant and was awarded an allocation of £4,502 for the 2021-22 academic year.

The funding is ring fenced to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted. The funding is to support the students who:

- have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or maths
- have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and would need catch-up support.

School has consulted with the identified students, their parents and subject teachers to prepare the most appropriate tuition programme. To ensure wrap-around support for the identified students, the school committed some of its revenue funding to deliver an enhanced support plan.

1. Sequenced activities which lead to high level of engagement and skill development
