Content and length of exam: 45 minutes

What does the exam look like? 2 questions.

Question 1: Find 4 things from the extract, exact quotations can be used here.

Question 2: Responding to a given extract from our study of 'A Christmas Carol'.

The question will follow the GCSE Literature format:

How is _____ presented in this extract.

How is _____ presented elsewhere in the novel (only what you've read so far).

The question will be either theme or character based.

How is the exam marked? Question 1 is marked out of 4. Question 2 is marked out of 30.

How to revise. Know the novel "A Christmas Carol". Practice PQE responses and utilise the learning from your lessons to understand the language/structural techniques typical of the novel ready to analyse the extract you will receive in the exam: an extract from 'A Christmas Carol'. Remember to use quotations to support your ideas and try to include historical context to support where appropriate.

History

Content and length of exam: 75 minutes

The Normans, 1060-1087

- What is it all about?

The death of Edward the Confessor in January 1066 led to a power vacuum in England. Harold Godwinson, the Earl of Wessex and brother-in-law of the King, seized the throne. However, William of Normandy was promised the throne by Edward the Confessor for decades of loyalty and assistance. Harald Hardrada, King of Norway, wanted to reestablish the Vikings as the rightful rulers of England. This 'game of thrones' culminated in two of the most significant battles in England's history; the Battle of Stamford Bridge and the Battle of Hastings. With victory secured at the Battle of Hastings, England's new king, William of Normandy soon begins to earn his nom-de-guerre, the Conqueror. In a series of battles and pacifications of the English people, William lays the foundation for English monarch to this day.
