### School aims

With reference to the School's **Vulnerable & Disadvantaged Students Improvement Plan**, our main strategic aim is:

Raising standards, opportunities and the academic progress for our vulnerable & Disadvantaged students.

### Provision in place

Southborough High School has a number of interventions put in place to support those students that are eligible to benefit from the PPG during 2019/20. PPG students will have benefited from one or more of the interventions funded or part funded through the PPG:

- Smaller class sizes and mixed ability grouping in ALL lessons in KS3 and KS4 to focus on intensive support and feedback to all PP students
- Employment of a Learning Facilitator to focus only on PP students academic progress
- Employment of a Learning Mentor to support vulnerable PP students and families
- 'Engage' mentoring programme to support disengaged PP students
- Extra English and Maths catch up sessions after school for underachieving PP students

### Measuring the impact of PPG funding in 2018/19

**Year 7** – In English, 74% of PP students made at least the expected levels of progress. In Maths it was 62%.

**Year 8** – In English, 80% of PP students made at least the expected levels of progress. In maths it was 43%.

**Year 9** – in English, 60% of PP students made at least the expected levels of progress. In maths it was 65%.

**Year 10** – In English, 58% of PP students made at least the expected levels of progress. In maths it was 63%.

**Year 11** –The progress score for Year 11 PP students was -1.01
